Upcoming Schedule of NET Health's COVID Vaccine Clinic Tyler, Texas (Tuesday, December 21, 2021)

Hours of Operation for Christmas and New Year Holidays

The COVID Vaccine Clinic at the Majesty Event Center will be closed Thursday December 23rd through Monday December 27th, in observance of the Christmas holiday weekend.

On Tuesday December 28th and Wednesday December 29th, the Majesty Event Center will resume its usual operating hours for the COVID vaccine clinics 8:30 a.m. until 4:30 p.m.

In observance of the New Year Holiday, NET Health's COVID Vaccine Clinic will be closed on Thursday December 30th through Monday January 3rd, 2022.

Beginning Tuesday January 4th, 2022, the NET Health COVID Vaccine Clinic will relocate to its new location at 815 North Spring Street, which is located directly behind our main offices at 815 North Broadway Avenue.

The COVID Vaccine Clinic will resume its operating hours of 8:30 a.m. until 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday as of Tuesday January 4th, 2022.

First and Second Doses of COVID-19 Vaccines

NET Health continues to encourage anyone who has yet to become vaccinated to start their COVID vaccine series as soon as possible to protect themselves and their loved ones.

Anyone over the age of 18 years and older can receive the Pfizer vaccine or the Moderna vaccine. Anyone between the ages of 5 - 17 can only receive the 2-Dose Pfizer vaccine.

Parents and guardians of children who are now eligible to receive the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine should consult a healthcare provider if they have questions about the benefits and risks of their child(ren) receiving the COVID vaccine.”

“Vaccination remains the best strategy to reduce the spread of COVID-19 in our communities,” says George Roberts, NET Health CEO. “All COVID-19 vaccines may be co-administered with other vaccines, including the seasonal influenza vaccine, during the same visit.”

Booster Dose of the Pfizer and Moderna

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) endorsed the expanded recommendations for booster doses for anyone ages 18 years and older who have already received the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine at least six months after their second dose.

CDC has also endorsed booster doses of the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine adolescents age 16 or age 17 who received their 2nd Pfizer vaccine at least six months ago.

If anyone has questions about their risks from COVID-19 and whether a booster dose is beneficial, it is advised that you consult your primary healthcare provider.

Bring your health insurance card when you come to receive your COVID vaccine

There is no cost to receive any COVID-19 vaccine.

Anyone who has health insurance such as Medicaid or employee-covered health insurance is asked to bring your insurance card with you when you receive your vaccine.
